ablic officials are at risk for targeted violence simply based on the position they hold and the decisions they are entrusted to make. The predatory violence that public officials have historically fallen victim to has been preceded by research and planning by individuals that have carried out targeted violence. The violence carried out by known attackers has not been limited to the public official, but has included family members of the public official as well. The availability of the public official's personal information through the internet allows individuals moving down the path to intended violence to conduct this research anonymously. The ability to limit the availability of personal information would inhibit the research of would be attackers and reduce the possibility of targeted violence towards public officials.
