- 1	COMBLAINANT'S OBENING PRICE IN SUPPORT OF THE PROPOSED DECISION	

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Code section 11517 for the possible actions the Commission can take regarding this proposed decision from the Administrative Law Judge after a full hearing on this matter.

Enforcement Division's recommendation is that the Commission make technical and minor changes to the proposed decision and then adopt it.² The Enforcement Division recommends the following technical and minor changes to the proposed decision since the agency may make clarifying changes or a change of a similar nature so long as the change does not affect the factual or legal basis of the proposed decision:

- 1. On page 5, paragraph 13, there is a misstatement of fact. Amend as follows: "Marshall's candidate ballot statement cost \$1,600. Marshall's wife, Janice Marshall, paid the \$1,600 by her personal credit card, on August ±7, 2015."
- 2. On page 5, paragraph 14, there is a misstatement of fact. Amend as follows: "The Committee reported the \$1,600 payment on Schedule <u>D B</u> of the Committee's pre-election campaign statement for the period ending September 19, 2015, and reported it on Schedule <u>B of that same pre-election statement</u> as a loan from Janice Marshall to the Committee received on August <u>17</u>, 2015."

Additionally, the proposed total administrative penalty of \$6,500 for the three proven violations of the Political Reform Act is appropriate in this matter because it takes into consideration all of the factors to be considered in framing a proposed decision.⁵

Thus, the Enforcement Division respectfully requests that the Commission make technical and minor changes in the proposed decision and adopt it as the decision.
